4 Affordable Ways to Get from the Metrolink Station to the Office



Riding Metrolink can get you to work faster and without the hassle and expense of driving. If your worksite is too far to be able to walk from the station, don't worry—there are other ways to travel the last stretch that won't break the bank:

1. Transfer from Metrolink to a bus or shuttle for a quick jaunt to your final destination.

Many Metrolink stations have shuttles that are timed to meet trains as they arrive at the station. Transfers are often free.

Look for transit and shuttle options at **metrolinktrains.com**.

2. Bike to and from the station and **bring your bike onboard.** Bikes are

allowed on all Metrolink trains, and there are also designated bike cars with room for more bikes.

3. In Los Angeles County, **transfer free to Metro Rail.** From Union Station, riders can hop onto the A, B and D lines to connect to locations from Pasadena to the Valley to the beach and beyond.

4. In Orange County, **OC Flex on- demand, curb-to-curb shuttle service**accepts valid Metrolink tickets as full fare for travel to and from the Laguna
Niguel/Mission Viejo Metrolink Station.

OC Flex offers service in zones near the stations. Fares for group rides are currently 50% off.

Metrolink's VC Line Now Runs Daily

As of last month, Metrolink's Ventura County Line service has been expanded to run seven days a week, with two round trips per day on Saturday and Sunday.

Metrolink added two new weekend trains, adjusting the schedule of VC Line train 162 and adding service on Sundays along the VC Line corridor.
